2014

The commencement of academic activities occurred on the 27th of June 2014, marking the inauguration of the School, catering to students from Class LKG to Class 1. Total strength was 197.

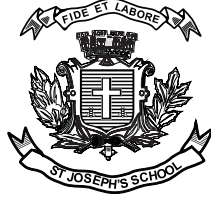

PROSPECTUS

St Joseph's School was established in 2014. It is administered by the Fathers of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits), a religious order of the Catholic Church, founded by St Ignatius of Loyola in 1540. The Jesuits are active in the field of education throughout the world. In India, they run many schools and colleges. These institutions are part of the Catholic Church's effort to impart education to the people of India and the world.

Jesuit Education is inspired by the life and teachings of Jesus Christ and based on the sound principles of character formation laid down by St Ignatius of Loyola.

OUR VISION:

Jesuit Education acknowledges God as the author of all reality, all truth and all knowledge. God is present and working in all of creation: in nature, in history and in person. Jesuit Education, therefore, affirms the radical goodness of the world 'charged with the grandeur of God.' It regards every element of creation as worthy of study and contemplation and capable of endless exploration.

OUR MISSION:

Education in a Jesuit Institution tries to create a sense of wonder and mystery in learning about God's creation. A more complete knowledge of creation can lead to a greater knowledge of God and a greater willingness to work with God in his ongoing work of creation. Subjects are taught in such a way that students, in humble recognition of God's presence, find joy in learning and thirst for greater and deeper knowledge.

1. God is especially revealed in the mystery of the human person, 'created in the image and likeness of God.' Jesuit Education probes into the meaning of human life and is concerned with the total formation of each student as an individual personally loved by God. The objective of Jesuit Education is to assist in the fullest possible development of all of the God-given talents of each individual person as a member of the human community.

In Jesuit Education, particular attention is given to the development of the imaginative, the affective and the creative dimensions of each student in all subjects of study. These dimensions enrich learning

and prevent it from being merely intellectual. For these same reasons, Jesuit Education includes opportunities through course work and through co-curricular activities which help all students to appreciate literature, aesthetics, music and fine arts.

Education of the whole person implies physical development in harmony with other aspects of the educational process. Jesuit Education, therefore, includes a well-developed programme of sports and physical education. In addition to strengthening the body, a good sports programme helps young boys and girls learn to accept both success and failure graciously; they become aware of the need to cooperate with others, using the best qualities of each individual to contribute to the greater advantage of the whole group.

All of these distinct aspects of the educational process have one common purpose; the formation of a balanced person with a personally developed philosophy of life that includes ongoing habits of reflection. To assist in this formation, individual subjects are related to one another within a well-structured educational programme; every aspect of school life contributes to the overall development of each individual person.

Since a true human is found only in relationships with others that include attitudes of respect, love and service; Jesuit Education stresses and assists in developing the role of each individual as a member of the human community. Students, teachers and all members of the educational community are encouraged to build solidarity with others that transcends race, culture or religion. In a Jesuit Institution, good manners are expected; the atmosphere is one in which all can live and work together in understanding and love with respect for all men and women as children of God.

2. Value-Oriented Education: Jesuit Education includes formation in values, in attitudes and an ability to evaluate criteria; that is, it includes formation of the will. Since the knowledge of good and evil, and of the hierarchy of relative goods is necessary both for the recognition of the different influences that affect freedom and for the exercise of freedom, education takes place in a moral context: knowledge is enhanced by virtue.

Personal development through the training of character and will, overcoming selfishness and lack of concern for others and the other

effects of sinfulness, and developing the freedom that respects others and accepts responsibility, are all aided by the necessary and fair regulations of the institution. These include a fair system of discipline, manifested in intellectual rigour, persevering application to serious study, and reference towards others that recognizes the human dignity of each individual.

3. Men and Women for Others: Jesuit Education helps students to realize that talents are gifts to be developed, not for self-satisfaction or self-gain, but rather, with the help of God for the good of the human community. Students are encouraged to use their gifts in the service of others, out of love for God.

4. A particular concern for the poor: Reflecting on the actual situation of today's world and responding to the call of Christ who had a special love and concern for the poor, the Jesuits have made a 'preferential option' for the poor. This includes those without economic means, the differently abled, the marginalized and all those who are, in any sense, unable to live a life of full human dignity. In Jesuit Education this option is reflected both in the students that are admitted and in the type of formation that is given.

Jesuit Institutions do not exist for any particular class of students. St Ignatius accepted institutions only when they were completely endowed so that education could be available to everyone. He insisted that special facilities for housing the poor be a part of the foundation of every institution that he approved and that teachers give special attention to the needs of the poor students. Today, although the situation differs greatly from country to country and the specific criteria for selecting the students depends on 'circumstances of place and person' every Jesuit Institution does what it can to make Jesuit Education available to everyone, including the poor and the disadvantaged. Financial assistance to those in need and reduction of cost whenever possible are means towards making this possible. Moreover, Jesuit Institutions provide academic and counselling assistance to those in need of it.

The Jesuit Institutions provide students with opportunities for contact with the poor and render service to them both within the institution and outside through service projects to enable students to learn to love all as brothers and sisters in the human community and also come to a better understanding of the causes of poverty.

5. Excellence in Formation: In Jesuit Education, the criterion of excellence is applied to all areas of student life. The aim is to provide the fullest possible development of every dimension of the person, linked to the development of a sense of values and a commitment to the service of others which gives priority to the needs of the poor and is willing to sacrifice self-interest for the promotion of justice. The pursuit of academic excellence is appropriate in a Jesuit school, but only within the larger context of human excellence.

The traditional aim of Jesuit Education has been to train 'leaders', men and women who assume responsible positions in society through which they have a positive influence on others. In today's understanding the 'Ignatian World View' is not to prepare a socio-economic elite, but rather to educate leaders in service.

6. Teaching Staff and Administrators: As far as possible, people chosen to join the educational community in Jesuit Institutions will be men and women capable of understanding its distinctive nature and of contributing to the implementation of characteristics that result from the Ignatian vision.

7. Parents: Principals, Teachers and Administrative Staff in Jesuit Institutions co-operate closely with parents, who are also members of the educational community. There is frequent communication and ongoing dialogue between home and the school. Parents are informed about the school activities; they are encouraged to meet the teachers to discuss the progress of their children. Parents are offered support and opportunities for growth in exercising their role as parents, and they are also offered opportunities to participate in advisory councils. In these and other ways parents are helped to fulfil their rights and responsibilities as educators at home by family, and they in turn contribute to the work of education going on in the school.

AIMS, OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES OF THE SCHOOL

1. St Joseph's School is a Religious Minority Institution. The School is affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) and consists of classes from LKG to Class 12.
2. Though primarily intended to educate the Catholic youth. However the school is open to all without distinction of caste or creed. Catholic pupils have a course on religious instruction.

Value-education is compulsory for all. Through religious and moral instruction, the School instills in children, good etiquette, holiness of life and dedicated service to humanity.

3. On the basic assumption that all children belong to one human family, the school emphasises fostering communal harmony at all levels. With this stress the school hopes to contribute her share towards building up a harmonious and non-violent nation.
4. Due attention is paid to physical education and games in school. Physical training and inter-house games are part of the school curriculum and are compulsory for all. The School has introduced a fitness Programme to enhance sporting capabilities of children from Pre Primary to Class 3.
5. Student Leadership: The school has a student council to assist the Principal and Staff in the smooth functioning of the school. The Student council consists of a Head boy, Head girl, Sports captain and Secretary, Discipline Secretary, Health and Hygiene Secretary, and Cultural Secretary.
6. The School Assembly is conducted every morning, including a theme based assembly every Tuesday and Friday morning. The assembly trains the students to be better leaders and citizens of our country.

The School follows the house system to inculcate a spirit of healthy competition and a sense of loyalty amongst the students. Each student will be in any of the four houses

Citrine (Yellow)

Emerald (Green)

Ruby (Red)

Sapphire (Blue)

representing precious gems of different colors.

7. English is the medium of instruction for all classes. As per the Language Guidelines Policy 2017-18 of Government of Karnataka, Kannada should compulsorily be taught as the first or second language. Accordingly, the school has opted for Kannada as the second language and Hindi as third language.

THE SCHOOL STRUCTURE AND SYSTEM

1. Pre KG, Pre-Primary (LKG & UKG) Class 1 to 12
2. The school follows co-education system.
3. The academic year is divided into two terms:
 - a) Term 1 : April to September
 - b) Term 2 : October to March
4. Languages taught
 - a) English
 - b) Kannada
 - c) Hindi

ASSESSMENTS AND PROMOTIONS

The school will conduct assessments as scheduled in this calendar, which the students must attend compulsorily.

Class 1 to 12

1. The school has adopted the system of two Periodic Assessments, a Half Yearly Exam and a Yearly Examination.
2. **Students must complete the notes and Assignments given on regular basis.**
3. If a holiday is declared for any unforeseen reasons on the scheduled assessment day, the same will be conducted after the last day of the assessment.
4. All students should have a minimum of **75%** attendance to write the Yearly Examination.
5. If the student's progress is not satisfactory, the parent must give a written undertaking stating that the child will make substantial progress and achieve the required grade level.

EVALUATIONS AND TESTS

1. Each term will have a Periodic Assessment followed by a Half Yearly and Yearly Examination for evaluation in Scholastic areas.
2. Examinations are held twice during the academic year, at the end of Term-1 and Term-2. Periodic Assessments are held during the course of each term.
3. Question and writing papers are provided for the examination and term tests.
4. Misconduct or malpractice in an examination disqualifies the student for the entire assessment / examination.

5. Students will not be allowed to write the Yearly Examination unless their school fee has been paid in full before the examination.
6. Marks and Grades for Class 1 - 12 are the official entries in the Assessment Report. Grades assigned are in differential of 10 Marks.
7. Promotion to the next/higher class will be determined, based on the student's academic performance throughout the year, with due weightage for different assessments and examinations, as per CBSE norms / guidelines.
8. Results declared at the end of the year are final in all cases.
9. A pupil who fails twice in school or is over age by two or more years owing to failure in more than one class will be required to take a Transfer Certificate.
10. Parents are requested to refer to the Calendar regularly and acknowledge any communication. They must sign the Assessment Report issued at the end of each term. Erasure/tampering of any kind in the Assessment Report will not be permitted and shall be dealt with strictly.

Assessments shall be as follows:

(Assessments Pattern is subject to change as per the latest norms / guidelines of CBSE)

- * *Subject enrichment activities will be conducted for all subjects over the academic year and will carry a weightage of 5%. Students must adhere to the format as instructed and follow the timelines for submission.*
- * *Notebooks- Maintenance and completion of classwork and homework will carry a weightage of 5%.*

Discipline (Class 1-12): The students will be assessed for discipline on the following factors - attendance, sincerity, behaviour, values, tidiness, respectfulness for rules and regulations, attitude towards society, nation and others. Grading on Discipline will be done term-wise on a 3-point grading scale (A=Outstanding, B=Very Good and C=Fair).

Colourful accessories, jewellery, mehendi, and long nails/nail polishes, **Earring for Boys , Fancy Keychains** are not permitted.

Students will be given two identity cards- a student ID and a Parent ID card. Student ID card must be worn every day and the parent ID must be shown by the authorized person while picking up the pupil

from school. Students must report about their lost ID cards to the class teachers. A replacement card must be collected from the school office by paying a fee of Rs. 100.00

Objectives:

- To create awareness about the basic health and wellness.
- To educate students on having balanced diet, simple home remedies for common ailments and choices for healthy living.

Art Club:

Art Club helps them to rejuvenate their artistic talents as well as their personalities thereby creating awareness and appreciation towards artistic pursuits.

Sports Club:

To nurture sports talents and develop one's personality through sportsmanship.

Heritage and Peace & Harmony Club:

- To value the rich heritage of the composite culture of our nation.
- To inculcate a sense of patience, tolerance as well as mutual understanding in the children so as to nurture a peaceful co-existence amongst them.

DISCIPLINARY REGULATIONS

1. (a) The working days are divided into two sessions. The morning session is from 8:30 am to 12:20 pm; the afternoon session is from 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm for Class 1 to 10 and for Class 11&12 1:00pm to 3:30 pm.
(b) Those who are forced by circumstances to come before 8:30 am shall sit in their respective classrooms and study.
(c) The first bell is given every day (8:20 am and 12:55 pm) and the second bell 5 minutes later (8:25 am and 1:00 pm). All students must be inside the classroom before the second bell. At the third bell, all must standstill, in their places silently.
(d) Pupils are expected to rise and wish while a teacher enters the classroom and must remain standing in silence until asked to sit or till the teacher takes his/her seat.
(e) Students are not allowed to leave the classroom during class hours without the respective teacher's permission.
2. Every pupil must wish the staff within the school premises or outside, on the occasion of his/her first encounter with them for the day.
3. Courtesy in behavior and politeness conversation is the hallmark of an educated person. Words like "Please", "Thank You", "May I" should be used in daily conversation.
4. Students are prohibited from bringing toys, changing of clothes or shoes without specific permission from the sports teachers and class teacher.
5. **Students involved in physical fights and/or gang fights, at anytime of the academic year, will be immediately dismissed from the school. The decision taken by the Principal will be final and binding.**

ATTENDANCE & REGULARITY

6. (a) Punctual and regular attendance is insisted upon. **CBSE mandates 75% of attendance, failing which the students will not be allowed to write their final exam.** Prior permission for leave of absence from school must be applied in writing by parents or guardian and for valid reasons only. General terms of excuse "some business", "some ceremony" etc., will not be

entertained. Attendance on the first working day and last working day is compulsory.

(b) Special notice will be taken of absence without leave letter from class tests. Those who absent themselves on the re-opening day after the holidays, without prior permission from the Principal/Co-ordinator, may have to pay a fine. In case of illness, a medical certificate must be submitted.

(c) Pupils must adhere to the school timings, habitual late arrival to school is discouraged and if a student is late to school more than three times, he/she is liable to be fined.

(d) When a pupil has been absent from school for some unforeseen reason e.g. illness, he/she must, on returning to school, produce a leave note signed by his/her parent or guardian (see Leave and Absence Record pg. 58 to 62). Should the absence exceed three successive days, prior notice must be forwarded to the Principal and permission be obtained.

(e) Continued absence for a week without leave approval shall be considered equivalent to withdrawal of a pupil from the school and his/her name shall be struck off the rolls.

(f) A pupil, absent without leave during any one class hour of either session of the day, shall be regarded as absent for the entire session.

(g) A pupil marked absent, shall continue to be marked absent, until he/she produces an order from the Principal/Co-ordinator to be marked present.

(h) A pupil who has been suffering from an infectious disease must produce a medical certificate from a registered medical practitioner, stating that he or she is fit to resume school; so that he/she may attend School without the risk of spreading infection. The Principal reserves the right, however, of extending the time of permitting the pupil to classes after obtaining medical advice.

7. When a calendar is lost, a new calendar should be obtained by paying Rs 100/- as fine, at the school office.
8. (a) Irregular attendance, insubordination to teachers, habitual inattention to school work and obscenity in word or action are sufficient reasons for permanent or temporary dismissal of

pupils. Minor offences, coming late to class habitually, moving about the corridors during class hours, are also punishable.

(b) Absenting oneself during important occasions will be considered as deliberate and commensurate action will be taken against such students.

(c) Damage to school property shall be made good, by the pupils concerned, by paying a fine.

9. The school will take cognizance of any serious misconduct of its pupils outside its precincts and should any serious charge be fairly substantiated, the guilty shall be punished according to the gravity of the offence.
10. **Books, magazines, newspapers, LED, fancy watches, video games, CDs, playing cards, phones, I- pods, digital and smart watches etc** which are not approved by the Principal/Co-ordinator are not allowed in the school. Only analogue watches are allowed.

Metal water bottles are not allowed.

11. **Electronic gadgets like Mobile phones, Digital Pads, MP3 players etc are strictly prohibited in School and will be treated as an offence and the device will be confiscated and not returned.** A student must produce a request letter seeking permission from Principal in case he/she has to carry a cellphone (only basic keypad type) to contact parents or guardians in order to update about their whereabouts. The keypad cellphone must be handed over in the reception in the morning and collected back at dispersal only.
12. The school calendar must be brought to school every day. Specimen signature of the parent (or guardian) has to be shown by every pupil on the page as indicated in the calendar.
13. All books and the belongings of the pupil should be labelled, by which the owner can be easily known. All stray or unclaimed property should be brought to the office. Any loss of articles suffered by the pupils must be reported immediately to the teacher-in-charge or Co-ordinator.
14. Pupils, without the Principal's permission, must not join any external club or societies or make any commitments that would interfere with their studies. They are not allowed to play in any team against the school or take part in any tournaments outside without the Principal's written permission.

15. Letters, officially addressed to the Principal/Co-ordinator, should contain reply postage, if a reply is desired.
16. Library books that are lost or damaged need to be replaced. In case the pupil is unable to procure the same, the cost of the book should be paid for in the school office.
17. No presents/gifts may be given by a student or a parent to a teacher either in school or outside school without the Principal's consent. Collection of money for any purpose requires the sanction of the Principal.
18. Every student must participate in school games and other activities unless declared physically unfit or exempted by the Principal. It is compulsory for all the students to take part in the Sport's Day programme. No student will be given permission to be absent on these days unless there is valid reason.
19. Students will not be permitted to go to their friend's house or any other place directly from school even if it is with their parent's permission.
20. Students are forbidden from bringing any change of clothes or make-up kit to school.
21. Students from class 7 onwards must wear regular uniform only on their birthdays.
- 22. The School encourages freedom of thought and speech. However, students must strictly refrain themselves from involving in politically or religiously sensitive issues that might call for strict action.**

Below are examples of behaviour and inappropriate dress / appearance that will be considered an act of misconduct.

Appearance

- Colouring of hair.
- Fancy haircuts/style
- Wearing fancy /digital/LED and smart watches/accessories
- Applying nail polish, lip gloss, lip balm with glitter or colour.
- Adorning hair with flowers, fancy clips, berets, coloured ribbons etc is not permitted.
- All boys need to attend school with short and proper hair cut.
- Nails should be clipped short.
- Gold earrings are not permitted

BEHAVIORS OUTSIDE SCHOOL PREMISES

A student of SJS represents the school even outside school hours and wherever he/she goes. Therefore, the school will take appropriate action when any immoral or violent misconduct is reported.

FEE REGULATIONS

1. All fees to be paid in the school office between 9:00 am and 1:00 pm.
2. The modes of fee payment will be online via Schoolphins link/app or DD in favour of St Joseph's School- KJES. **QR CODE on Page no 35.**
3. For online payment, the fee receipt will have to be downloaded and printed if necessary and for DD, the fee receipt will be given immediately at the school office.
4. You are advised to pay the total school fee at the beginning of the school academic year and within the stipulated time.
5. On no account can a Transfer Certificate be issued to a pupil whose fees have not been paid in full.
6. Fees once paid will not be refunded.

WITHDRAWAL

1. Application for Transfer or Conduct Certificates shall be submitted in writing and should be made by the first week of March.
2. Transfer or Conduct Certificate will not ordinarily be issued during vacation.
3. When an application for Transfer or Conduct Certificate is made after a lapse of more than one year from the date of which the pupil left school, a special fee of Rs 100/- shall be charged.

TO PARENTS AND GUARDIANS

1. Parents and Guardians are requested to cooperate with the school authorities by enforcing discipline at home. In order that lessons may be duly revised, they are requested to supervise their wards study at home. If parents do not insist on regular attendance and home study, the results in the examinations will not meet the expectations/will not be satisfactory.
2. Parents/Guardians are recommended to call on the Principal/Co-ordinator at least once in a term to enquire about the conduct, progress and attendance of their child. They should make it a point to meet the teachers without fail during the Parent Teacher Meeting (PTM) held after each assessment.
3. Parents/Guardians are expected to scrutinize the Assessment reports issued periodically to their children and take necessary measures to improve the shortcomings in their progress.
4. All Parents/Guardians are made members of the Parent-Teacher Association (PTA) of the school, by paying the membership fee at the beginning of the year. PTA aims at fostering closer relationship, mutual understanding and co-operation between the home and the school. It is compulsory on the part of the parents to attend the PTA meetings when called upon to do so.
5. Parents should ensure that their children note down the daily homework in the calendar and make them complete it.
6. Those parents who desire to go through the answer scripts may do so within 3 days from the issuing of the Report Card.
7. **Parents/Guardians or other persons are not allowed to visit the students or their teachers during school hours without the Principal's/ Co-ordinator's permission.**

Parents/guardians may meet teachers on Friday afternoon 3:15 pm and for class 11 & 12 after 3:30 pm.

8. Any form of criticism of a teacher or of the school in front of students should be strictly avoided. If done, the student loses respect for his/her teacher and fails to learn appropriate behaviour. If you have a genuine complaint or problem, please contact the Principal/Co-ordinator.
9. The Management will not be responsible for your child once he/she is picked up by the parent/guardian/drivers from the School.
10. Students are expected to be punctual and disciplined. With the co-operation of parents and guardians the school authorities will be able to shape the child into an honest, hardworking, service-minded and God-fearing citizen of India.
11. **It is mandatory for parents to attend the Orientation Day, Curriculum Day, Parenting Sessions & Parent Teacher Meetings.** Prior permission from the Principal/Co-ordinator is required if unable to attend.
12. Parents are hereby informed that the students are strongly discouraged from communicating with teachers on social media like Facebook, Whatsapp etc.
13. Parents are discouraged from engaging on Whatsapp groups for any school related matter created by unauthorised sources. You may refer the school's Whatsapp broadcast for any update.
14. Any dispute or misunderstanding between students in the school premises must be referred to school authorities and not dealt with directly by parents.

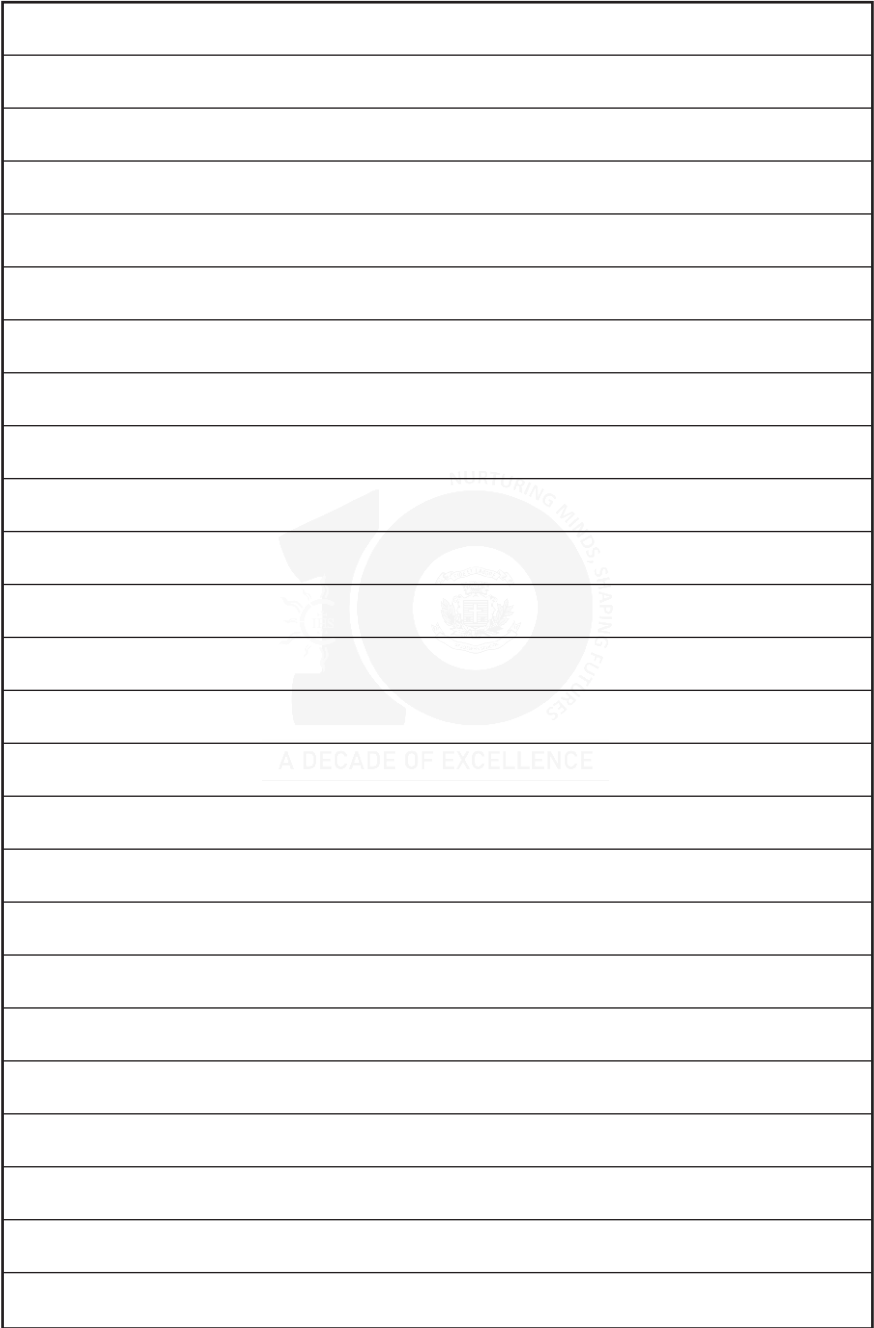
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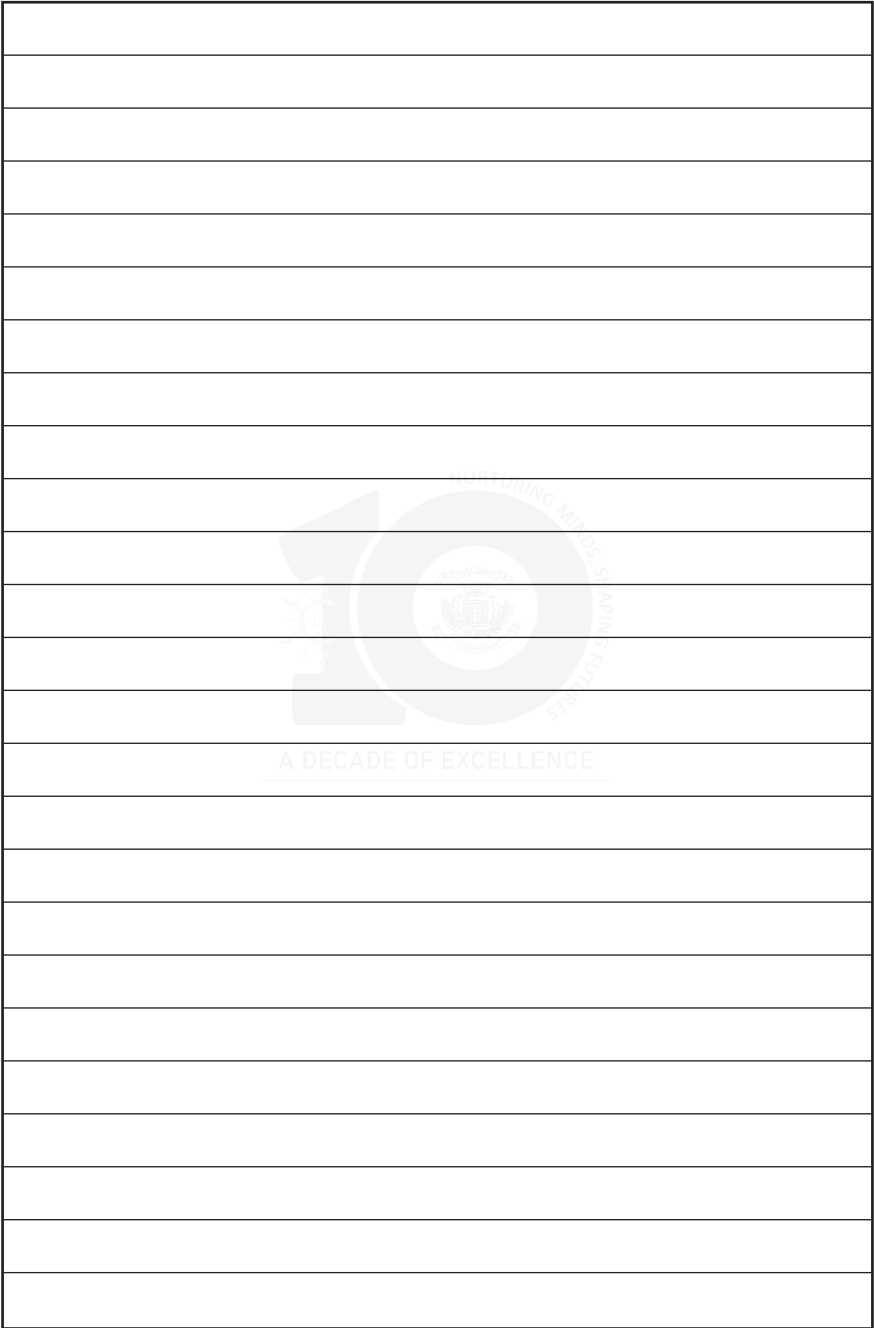
PERIODIC ASSESSMENT - 1 TIME TABLE

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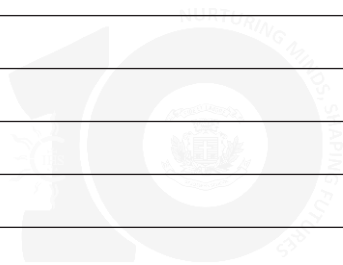

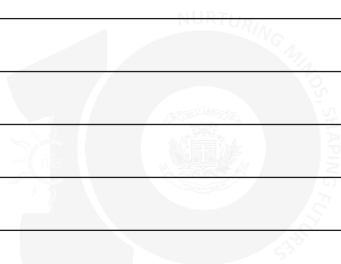

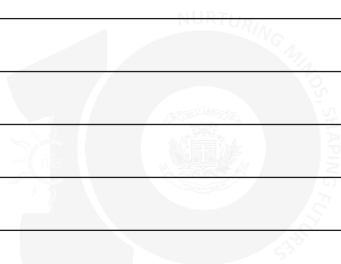
